CHORAL EVENSONG for Advent Sunday

27th November 2022 7pm Central Africa Time "Evensong" is the prayer service of the Anglican Church traditionally held at sunset. Created out of the turmoil of the protestant reformations in the 16th century, its form is borrowed from the evening services of the Roman Catholic Church, while its spirit, invoked in our worship this evening, is ecumenical, calling upon the varied traditions of faith found in Malawi and in this school community. This evening, it is used to mark the beginning of the season of Advent, which anticipates the birth of our Messiah.
